Student must earn a 2.50 institutional cumulative grade point average to graduate.</li> <li>3. Of the credits completed in residence at least 30 credits must be in 300-400 level accounting, business administration, and management information systems.</li> <li>4. Students must be accepted to the professional program prior to the completion of the last 30 credits in 300-400 level accounting, business administration, and management information systems courses.</li> </ol>
