***Teaching specialty courses.

Students must be admitted to the School of Education in order to take 400-level Education classes. Admission guidelines are:

1. Cumulative GPA (NDSU plus transfer credits) of 2.75 or better.
2. A GPA of 2.75 in teaching specialty courses.
3. B or better in COMM 110.
4. English writing competence. (2.50 in ENGL 110 and 120 combined, B or better in ENGL 358, 20 English ACT.)
5. Achievement of minimum scores on the Praxis I (PPST) test.
6. A minimum of 40 hours working with youth.
7. Reflections of the INTASC standards.
8. Admission interview.

A GPA of 2.75 or better is required for placement in student teaching and exit from the program.
